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Over 430 Groups Launch DC Billboards to Honor President Carter's Legacy Opposing the Death Penalty and Urge President Biden to Commute Remaining Death Sentences

Washington, DC - Representatives of a coalition of nearly 450 organizations convened by Death Penalty Action will gather near the White House at 10am, Wednesday, January 8, 2025 to launch a fleet of mobile billboards with messages quoting former President Jimmy Carter on the death penalty and urging President Biden to "FinishTheJob" by commuting the remaining SEVEN death sentences on federal (3) and military (4) death rows prior to leaving office.

Unwavering in their commitment to prevent the Trump Administration from following through on the Agenda2025 plan to drastically increase executions, the organizations have also released [this new video on social media](#) and are besieging the White House Comment Line during its open hours of 11am to 3pm ET on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays.

The event coincides with the planned delivery to the White House of over 50,000 signatures on petitions hosted by Death Penalty Action and Faithful America in addition to a delivery of the revised letter endorsed by over 430 organizations.

The letter asserts:

"In your statement, you said you granted clemency because you wanted to "prevent the next Administration from carrying out executions." This gives us hope. Unless you finish the job by granting clemency to the three men remaining on federal death row and extending your mercy to the four men on military death row, you will leave those seven men vulnerable to execution under Donald Trump's administration. This would seem counter to your intent."

Sharon Risher, daughter of Ethel Lance and cousin to Susie Jackson and Tywanza Sanders, whose killer is a prisoner on Federal Death Row in the wake of his racially motivated mass shooting at Mother Emmanuel AME Church in Charleston, SC in 2015, also [made a brief video statement which may be seen here](#).

Additionally, in the revised letter the campaign added an endorsement of two related pardon requests. The groups ask President Biden to grant the pardon request of [Billie Allen](#), whose death sentence was commuted and who asserts his innocence, as well as the posthumous pardon request for [Alfred Bourgeois](#). Mr. Bourgeois was executed on December 11, 2020, during the Trump execution spree. His family has presented a credible innocence claim and has written to President Biden requesting a pardon on his behalf. Bourgeois's daughter makes her [video plea here](#).

While not included in the letter, Death Penalty Action is also endorsing the request for a posthumous pardon of [Ethel Rosenberg](#), who was executed by the US Government in 1953. [Click here](#) to watch Sunday's conversation with Jennifer Meeropol, granddaughter of Ethel Rosenberg.

TOLLING "THE DELAWARE BELL"

Wednesday's protest will include use of "The Delaware Bell," a large bell that was rung outside most of the 16 executions that took place in Delaware between 1992 and 2012. This is of particular significance today because President Biden represented the state of Delaware in Congress for decades.

Delaware's death penalty laws were ruled unconstitutional and thrown out in 2016. After Delaware legislators scrubbed all language pertaining to executions from the state code in June, 2024, Delaware Citizens Opposed to the Death Penalty gave their bell to Death Penalty Action for use in protests at executions across the United States.

The Delaware Bell was sounded at executions in Alabama, Indiana and Oklahoma in the last of the 25 executions in 2024. [See image from the Associated Press](#). THE FOLLOWING STATEMENTS MAY BE QUOTED

Responding to news that two of the 37 prisoners whose death sentences were commuted are challenging the commutation, Abraham Bonowitz said, "This illustrates one of the challenges of our criminal legal system. When a prisoner has a wrongful conviction claim, it is to their benefit to be under a sentence of death because there are more resources and avenues of appeal available to them. Without a death sentence they are completely on their own. It truly is a gamble, but I hope the powers that be take note. Our system has serious flaws and the risk of executing innocent people is very real."

RESPONDING TO THE 37 COMMUTATIONS

"I am happy for all those whose sentences have been commuted, and grateful to President Biden for this unprecedented act of mercy, but this is so unfair. I need the President to understand that when you put a killer on death row, you also put their victim's families in limbo with the false promise that we must wait until there is an execution before we can begin to heal. Every time this case comes up, I am brought back to the day my mother and cousins were murdered, and I need that to stop. Politics has gotten in the way of mercy. You can't rank victims, Mr. President. I am begging you to finish the job, not only with the three men left on federal death row, but also with those on the military death row. There's still time. Finish the job."

"Every person left on the federal and military death rows is being handed over to Donald Trump for execution. Death Penalty Action opposes the death penalty in all cases because it is a failed public policy any way you look at it. "I stood at the finish line of the Boston Marathon on April 15, 2013 after completing the race to wait for my sister to finish her run. I witnessed the bombing. I also witnessed the injured being carried into the medical tent. The visions haunt me today. I was initially thrilled that Dzhokhar Tsarnaev received the death penalty. Today I have changed. I believe he deserves life in prison without parole, and I am disturbed that President Biden has not commuted his death sentence to life without parole."

Former US Congresswoman & current Ohio Representative Jean Schmidt, a leading "pro-life" Republican, witnessed the bombing and for many years was an advocate of the death penalty. She has reversed that position and now opposes the death penalty in all cases.

"Just when I thought Joe Biden was going to give our nation some ethical clarity, he has presented us with a new nightmare...the ranking of murder victims. Either Biden finishes the job and commutes all federal death sentences or we are left in the same place we were before...a moral abyss of federal sentencing that only pursues death sentences in rare cases, prioritizing some murder victims above all others."

ADDITIONAL BACKGROUND

Rev. Risher was a featured speaker on a congressional briefing panel hosted by Rep. Ayanna Pressley on December 10, 2024, in which she made the following statement, which is included in a [new video](#) being shared on social media.

"I learned that my mother and my loved ones were gunned down by a white supremacist trying to start a race war. He is not an innocent man on death row, but he is a man. He has humanity, and I have been willing and worked hard to give forgiveness to [him]. I do not want him to die. To spend the rest of his life in prison? Yes. But not for him to die in the name of my family. We are urging you, President Biden. I hope you hear my words. I hope you get to hear the pain in my voice."

The panel also featured noted death penalty experts, remarks from current federal death row prisoner Billie Allen, who is seeking a pardon from President Biden, his sister Yvette Allen, and Lisa Brown, whose son was Christopher Vialva, who was executed in the federal execution spree in the final six months of the first Trump Administration.

Earlier in the day on December 10, Rev. Risher and Lisa Brown delivered over [36,000 petition signatures](#) and an updated letter, [from over 430 organizations](#), urging President Biden to commute all federal and military death sentences before the end of his term. These deliveries augment the thousands of phone calls being made to the White House during calling hours from 11am to 3pm each Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday as part of [the growing campaign](#). These calls will continue to urge President Biden to finish the job, even as the official White House comment line appears to not be functioning "during the holidays." Death Penalty Action members are calling the White House switchboard instead.

Bonowitz was also a leader in protests outside the execution of Timothy McVeigh in 2001. He is the primary architect of Death Penalty Action's campaign to halt federal executions.

Previous versions of the letter had urged President Biden to make good on his campaign pledge to end the federal death penalty, and to work with Congress to pass the Federal Death Penalty Prohibition Act sponsored by Rep. Ayanna Pressley and Senator Richard Durbin.
